Use the JTO to Reduce Your Tuition Burden

- Pardes families have the opportunity to offset as much of your tuition as you may want through JTO programs, using either or both:
 - Need-based scholarships
 - Taxpayer-recommended scholarships

Use the JTO to Reduce Your Tuition Burden

JTO Taxpayer-Recommended Scholarship (1)	6,200	6,200

The Private School Tuition Tax Credit Basics

The Private School Tuition Tax Credit

- Tax **credits** are offsets to the amount of tax you owe the State of Arizona. They are different from tax **deductions**.
 - Credits decrease the amount of tax you owe the state dollar-for-dollar
 - Deductions decrease the amount of taxable income you report
- Taxpayers can donate up to the following amounts (for 2018):
 - \$2,213 for married, filing jointly
 - \$1,107 for individual filers
 - Tax credits claimed using Form 348 and Form 323 on your Arizona tax return

The Private School Tuition Tax Credit

	Filing Jointly	Filing Individually
Total Arizona Income Tax Obligation	\$3,500	\$2,500
Private School Tax Credit Donation	2,213	1,107
Remaining Income Tax Due (1)	\$1,287	\$1,393


⁽¹⁾ If a taxpayer has already paid/withheld their full tax obligation, they can still take the tax credit and will receive a refund for the overpayment

The JTO

What is the JTO?

- The JTO is a needs-based school tuition organization for Jewish day schools
- As of December 2018, the JTO now also accepts taxpayers' recommendations:
 - **School-recommended** funds
 - Student-recommended funds
- 70% of the **recommended donation** awarded to the recipient
 - At least 20% of the recommended funds will go to the needs-based fund
 - The remaining 10% by law can be used for JTO administrative expenses

The JTO's Changes

What do the JTO's Changes Mean for YOU?

 If you receive needs-based funds from the JTO, you can supplement these funds with taxpayer-recommended funds to further offset your out-ofpocket tuition expense

• If you do not receive **needs-based** funds from the JTO, you can solicit **taxpayer-recommended** funds to offset your **out-of-pocket** tuition expense

• If you are not interested in soliciting **taxpayer-recommended** funds specifically for your child, you can still help Pardes by soliciting taxpayers to take the tax credit for Pardes, **recommending the school**

Maximizing your Benefit

How to Maximize your Benefit

- Learn how this program works so it is easy for you to explain
- Talk with others who have utilized this program
- Call the JTO or Pardes to ask for assistance
- Make a list of people you can contact to ask for assistance
- Actively solicit donors—any person who pays Arizona state income tax is eligible to take the tax credit

- Neighbors
- Synagogue members
- Business partners
- Work colleagues

Do's and Don'ts in Soliciting Donations

- **DO** take your own tax credit and recommend Pardes
 - Pardes would receive approximately \$300,000 of additional tax credit funds if every family gave their own tax credit to Pardes
- DO NOT solicit donors who already contribute to the JTO
 - Existing donors' funds are vital support for the needs-based awards our parents receive.
 - Pardes receives approximately \$1.3 million per year from the needs-based fund
- DO NOT swap recommended tax credits with another family—this is illegal by Arizona law



How to Apply for JTO Funds


- Apply online through the JTO's website:

 - A simple online application is required for donor-recommended awards, and will be available on the JTO's website



State of Arizona Legal Information

A SCHOOL TUITION ORGANIZATION CANNOT AWARD, RESTRICT OR RESERVE SCHOLARSHIPS SOLELY ON THE BASIS OF A DONOR'S RECOMMENDATION. A TAXPAYER MAY NOT CLAIM A TAX CREDIT IF THE TAXPAYER AGREES TO SWAP DONATIONS WITH ANOTHER TAXPAYER TO BENEFIT EITHER TAXPAYER'S OWN DEPENDENT.

By law, the JTO is not allowed to share donor information with parents. You should ask your donors to send you a confirmation of their donation for your records, so you can properly acknowledge their donation.

Corporate Donations

 Arizona tax credit law also allows for corporate donations, which the JTO accepts

 Corporate donations can be recommended to a specific school but not a specific individual

 If you are aware of a corporation who wishes to make a tax credit donation, please refer them to Patti Evans
