1. What Will My Child Learn?

During these formative years, it is more important than ever to establish strong foundations for future success. Find out as much as possible about the curriculum used, how much flexibility teachers have to creatively present content, and what specialty classes are available.

2. How Will My Child Learn?

A love for learning starts early, and the approach to education matters, perhaps more than ever, in elementary school. It's not enough to find out what is being taught; seek to discover how the content is being delivered, and how young minds are engaged throughout the day.

Pardes emphasizes:

- Differentiated instruction in small classes
- Hands-on, project-based learning
- STEAM activities
- Technology integration

- Social and and emotional development



Any school should be able to expand upon the best practices and research-based methodologies used by their faculty. Be sure to ask how teachers support each child's learning style, build their confidence, and help them learn effectively.



3. Will My Child Be Safe?

Between kindergarten and grade four, your child will spend over 5,000 hours at school. Like all parents, you want to know that your child will be in a safe environment each day. Don't hesitate to ask specific questions around campus security. An elementary school should go to great lengths to protect their young learners.

Consider asking about:

- Gated entryways and/or locking doors
- Police presence on campus
- Surveillance technology
- Drop-off and pick-up processes
- Safety drills



Beyond these things, ask what measures are in place to ensure each child's emotional safety. The learning community at Pardes is known for low student-to-teacher ratios, a family-like environment, and a zero-tolerance policy for bullying. Each of these ensure our elementary school students are able to learn with confidence in an atmosphere that feels comfortable and nurturing.



4. What Is Your Vision for Graduates?

Elementary school is a transformative period. It is wise to consider a program's "end goals" for each child — the knowledge, skills, and characteristics students will possess upon graduation.

Through authentic character education and leadership development, the Pardes graduate becomes:

- A critical thinker and communicator
- Deeply connected to his or her Judaism
- An individual who embraces a love of learning
- A mensch



After graduating from Pardes in 8th grade, students go on to top high schools and renowned colleges. When considering any school, find out where graduates continue their education and their acceptance rates. What is the level of academic success when they attend these new schools? You might even ask to speak with a parent of a graduate to find out about his/her experience.



5. Will the Value Exceed the Cost for our Family?

Education is a valuable, lifelong investment — perhaps your most important opportunity to invest in your child's life. With any significant financial commitment, you want to know that the value will exceed the cost. Parents who choose Pardes do so because they are confident they will experience rewards today (assurance their child is known and loved at school) and tomorrow (confidence in the foundations being laid for middle school, high school, and college).
